Overview of travel guide and testing regimes Vaccinated Travel Lane travellers (as of 15 Mar 2022)

Fully vaccinated travellers from applicable countries can now travel to Singapore via the Vaccinated Travel Lanes (VTL) when attending a MICE event and travelling into Singapore from applicable countries/region, delegates who meet the VTL requirements may seek entry into Singapore by applying for a Vaccinated Travel Pass (VTP). Please refer to the Safe Travel website for the latest list of eligible list of countries and VTL requirements. If you are travelling from Macao, Mainland China or Taiwan, you may apply for an Air Travel Pass (ATP). If you are departing from a country/region without ATP or VTL, please contact us at info@siww.com.sg to facilitate your entry.

Delegates may refer to the following steps to ensure a seamless, safe and trusted experience when they journey into Singapore.

Pre-Arrival

		Checklist (Tick as you go)
	Within 3-30 days before intended date of entry into Singapore, apply for a Vaccinated Travel Pass (VTP).	
1	To apply for a VTP, you are required to be fully vaccinated with WHO-EUL vaccines and to upload an accepted proof of vaccination at the point of application. You must have only travelled to/transit via any VTL (Air) countries and/or Singapore for the last 7 consecutive days before departing for Singapore. You will also need to travel to Singapore on a designated VTL flight.

2	Upon approval of the pass, you can proceed to apply for visa (if required) and book tickets on designated VTL flight.	
3	Stay covered by purchasing mandatory travel insurance that meets the minimum coverage of \$30,000 for COVID-19-related medical treatment and hospitalisation costs for the duration of your stay in Singapore.	
4	Within 3 days before departure, complete your SG Arrival Card (SGAC) and travel history declaration online within 3 days prior to your arrival in Singapore.	
5	Within 2 days before departure, take a COVID-19 PCR test or professionally administered Antigen Rapid Test (ART). Obtain a certificate for your negative pre-departure COVID-19 PCR test result in English, stating the time and date on which the test was administered. Fully vaccinated recovered travellers may qualify for exemption from COVID-19 tests. Please refer to FAQs for more information.	
6	Before departure , prepare <u>authorised ART kits</u> for your on-arrival unsupervised self-administered ART within 24 hours of arrival in Singapore and please download and install the TraceTogether (TT) app on your mobile device. Alternatively, upon arrival in Singapore, you can obtain a TT token at a fee of S\$13 per token from the <u>Singapore Visitor Centre at Orchard Gateway</u> .

On Arrival in Singapore

Welcome to Singapore! Upon arrival, you will need to present the following documents:

- 1. Valid Visa, where required
- 2. Vaccinated Travel Pass (VTP) for the specified period of entry into Singapore
- 3. Physical or electronic copy of travel insurance policy
- 4. Mobile device with TraceTogether app downloaded

5. For recovered travellers who contracted COVID-19 before being vaccinated,

- a. Acceptable proof of Vaccination certificate (electronic or physical copy) in English, stating one dose of any WHO-EUL vaccines after at least 28 days after the diagnosis
- b. Acceptable proof of the first diagnosis date in English
- c. Negative pre-departure COVID-19 PCR or professionally administered ART test result in English

6. For fully vaccinated and recently recovered travellers (within 7-90 days from last infection before departure to Singapore),

- Acceptable proof of Vaccination certificate (electronic or physical copy) in English, stating the required doses of WHO-EUL vaccines
- b. Acceptable proof of the first diagnosis date in English

7. For all other travellers,

- a. Acceptable proof of Vaccination certificate (electronic or physical copy) in English
- b. Negative pre-departure COVID-19 PCR or professionally administered ART test result in English.

Complete your on-arrival unsupervised self-administered ART using self-procured <u>authorised ART kits</u> within 24 hours of arrival in Singapore. Travellers are required to report their negative test result via https://www.sync.gov.sg before proceeding with their activities in Singapore.

During and after stay in Singapore

Your safety is our priority. Please adhere to prevailing public health measures during your stay in Singapore and monitor your health.

If you are travelling outbound to a country that requires visitors to be tested prior to returning, complete a pre-departure COVID-19 PCR test at authorised clinics. Location-based list can be accessed via OneMap.

Keep your TraceTogether app activated while you are in Singapore. You are encouraged to retain the app and data or 14 consecutive days after departure from Singapore for contact tracing purposes, if necessary.

Visa application

Please check the <u>Immigration & Checkpoints Authority of Singapore (ICA)</u> website to ascertain if you require a visa for entry into Singapore. To request for a letter from the organisers for your visa application, please contact <u>chloepung@experiaevents.com</u>. Only registered attendees will be entertained.

Frequently Answered Questions (FAQs)

Q) What are the testing regimes for my travel into Singapore?

ANS: You are required to:

- 1. Take a COVID-19 pre-departure test within 2 days before departure and obtain a copy of the negative COVID-19 test report that:
 - Is an Antigen Rapid Test (ART) administered by a trained professional (self-swabs not allowed) OR Polymerase Chain Reaction Test taken at an internationally accredited or recognised lab/clinic/medical facility
 - Is in English (or accompanied with an English translation);
 - Contains the following:
 - COVID-19 test results and date of test;
 - Traveller's name; and
 - > Date of Birth or Passport number (per the passport used to travel to Singapore).
- 2. Take an on-arrival unsupervised self-administered ART using self-procured <u>authorised ART kits</u> within 24 hours of arrival in Singapore. Travellers are required to report their negative test result via https://www.sync.gov.sq before proceeding with their activities in Singapore

Q) I have recovered from COVID-19 before being vaccinated. Am I considered fully vaccinated?

ANS: Travellers who contracted COVID-19 before getting vaccinated can take one dose of any WHO-EUL vaccines at least 28 days after the diagnosis of COVID-19 infection, to be considered fully vaccinated for travel to Singapore. You are to present an acceptable Vaccination Certificate in addition to an acceptable proof of the first diagnosis date. Both proof are to be in English.

You are still required to undergo the testing regimes under VTL. Please refer to STO's website for more information.

Q) I have recently recovered from COVID-19 after being fully vaccinated. Can I be exempted from testing regime?

ANS: Travellers who have recovered from a COVID-19 vaccination within **7 – 90 days before date of departure may be exempted from prevailing testing regimes. You will need to present an acceptable Vaccination Certificate in addition to an acceptable proof of the first diagnosis date within the stipulated period.** Please refer to the <u>STO's website</u> for more information.

Frequently Answered Questions (FAQs)

Q) What is an accepted form of vaccination certificates for my country of vaccination?

ANS: Please refer to STO's website for list of acceptable vaccination certificates by country, under Vaccination Requirements -> Digitally Verifiable Vaccination Certificate and QR Code Issues.

Q) What is an accepted form of medical proof of my COVID-19 recovery?

ANS: Any of the following showing a positive COVID-19 infection:

- COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction Test (PCR Test) administered at an <u>internationally accredited or recognised lab/clinic/medical facility</u>;
 OR
- Antigen Rapid Test (ART) result administered by a trained professional OR
- Medical discharge memo issued by the relevant state authority or licensed medical professional, showing:
 - · Name (per travel document used to enter Singapore);
 - ID number (per travel document used to enter Singapore), or Date of Birth

For exemption of testing regime, date of infection must fall within 7 - 90 days (inclusive) before the date of departure for Singapore.

Q) Which are the authorised ART kits that can be used for the unsupervised self-administered ART?

ANS: Please refer to the list of authorised ART kits <u>here</u>. Travellers are required to report their test result via <u>https://www.sync.gov.sg</u> before proceeding with their activities in Singapore.

Frequently Answered Questions (FAQs)

Q) Where can I find the nearest clinic for my Pre-Departure Test before leaving Singapore?

ANS: You can access list of authorized clinics <u>here</u>. Alternatively, you may use the <u>OneMap</u> to find nearest clinics to you via location-based sharing or by inputting the postal code of your location on the search bar. You are to select "COVID-19 Test Providers".



Q) What happens if I am infected with COVID-19 when I am in Singapore for the event?

ANS: Please visit this page for information on the recovery procedure (https://www.covid.gov.sg/travellers). Depending on individuals' symptoms, travellers will be required to isolate in declared hotel accommodation, residential accommodation, or an appropriate COVID-19 care facility. Costs of COVID-19-related medical treatment and hospitalisation costs will be borne by travellers.

Q) Is COVID-19 insurance mandatory? Where can I purchase the insurance?

ANS: It is also mandatory for travellers entering Singapore to have travel insurance for COVID-19-related medical treatment and hospitalisation costs in Singapore, with a minimum coverage of \$\$30,000. The travel insurance will help pay for the costs of medical treatment in Singapore.

List of Singapore-based insurers can be found here, but travellers are free to purchase from overseas insurers as well.
